2) Workshop Dates

The team discussed dates of other events being held in the fall. At the last meeting, the group was focusing on potential workshop dates during the last week of November or the first week of December. On Nov. 24-26, there is a meeting of the Red Deer River Watershed Alliance, the basin Martha Kostuch lived in. On Dec. 1-3, there is a meeting of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. It was felt the workshop should not conflict with the alliance meeting. However the group didn't expect the federation meeting would draw the same audience as the workshop would. Kerra reported that Martha's family would try to send someone to the workshop. However since their

plans for fall were not finalized, the family suggested the team schedule the workshop at its own discretion.

Decision: The team has narrowed down the workshop dates to Dec. 1-2 or Dec. 2-3.

3) Speakers

Kim updated the group on speaker information. The fee for Daniel Shapiro of Harvard's Program on Negotiation is \$15,000 US, plus travel, accommodation and incidentals. We are still waiting for a response from Lawrence Susskind of the Consensus Building Institute. No video is available of Dale Zaiser, a B.C. consultant and teacher with the Justice Institute of British Columbia. Last year, the Alberta Environmental Network brought in speaker Juliana Birkhoff of the Consensus Building Institute.

Action Item 4.3: Kim will check with AEN for information on Juliana Birkhoff as a speaker.

The team discussed the video clip of Daniel Shapiro. Comments included:

- Mesmerizing speaker/educational and dynamic
- Animated

Some team members could not open the clip of Lawrence Susskind. Comments included:

- Not as dynamic as Shapiro
- Sounded like he had so much experience (60-70 case histories)
- Provided good information
- Very thorough

The \$15,000 raised concerns among team members. The group wanted to know how much time speakers would spend and what services they would provide for their fee.

Action Item 4.4: Kim will check to see what services/time speakers offer for their fee.

The group also acknowledged the choice of the speaker will affect the program and the marketing of the workshop. It was agreed a speaker with a broader focus would be preferred to a speaker who had a narrower scope.

Action Item 4.5 Kim will try to get more information Lawrence Susskind and Dale Zaiser – especially an audio or video clip.
