

## Why renew the Clean Air Strategy?


• The impact of non-point emission sources has changed



## 1. Airshed Planning and Management of Non-Point Sources

- Integrate Land-use regions and air zones
- Implement Management Frameworks and plans to identify and address air quality issues
- Develop and implement policies to manage non-point source and non-regulated emissions



## 2. Shared Responsibility and Partnerships

- Develop education tools
- Use economic instruments to promote wise choices
- Clarify roles of cross ministry stakeholders and partners
- Coordinate development and integration of air related policies (across GoA, Governments and agencies)



## 3. Integrated Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting

- Rationalize monitoring programs
- Enhance data management and access
- Enhance evaluation on the effectiveness of the management system
- Assure timely access to information by enhancing monitoring reporting







## 4. Knowledge Enhancement

- Increase public knowledge related to air quality
- Enhance air research and management
- Encourage continuous improvement in technology development
- Improve knowledge of emissions sources through emission inventories
