WHAT WE DO

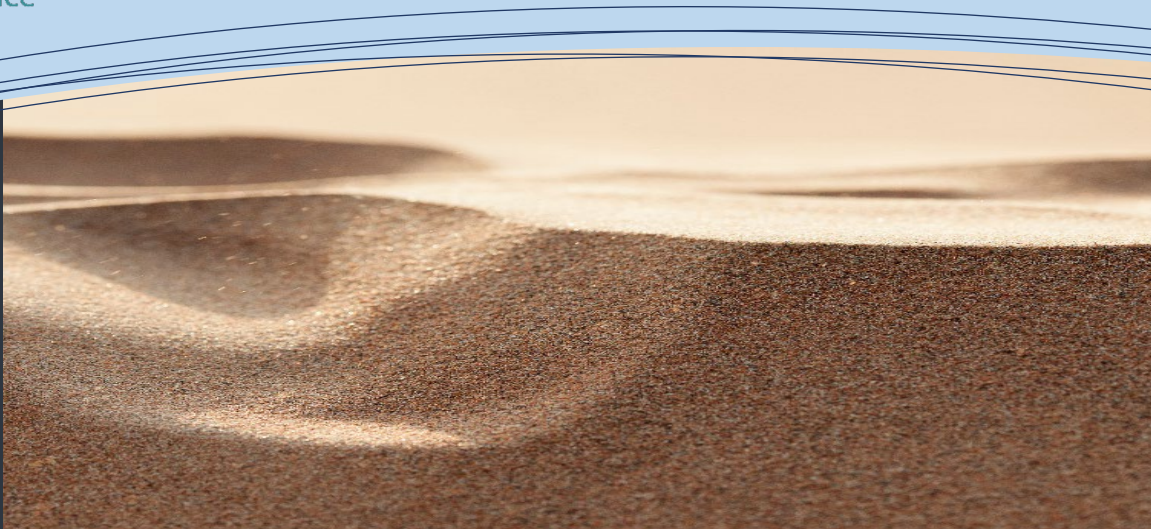
We support three air quality management goals:

The Government of Alberta is committed to managing Alberta's air quality. Dust can be a significant contributor to particulate matter levels and is applicable across multiple sectors.

Project Goal:

To provide guidance information that will enable Albertans to reduce and mitigate particulate matter emissions from anthropogenic non-point sources to help improve local air quality management in Alberta and support regional CAAQS achievement.

Scope:

Development and dissemination of a best practices guide for dust management that:

- identifies why this issue is important and what can be done to address it
- provides templates for environmental policies and plans.
- prepares for potential requirements in the future

What we delivered:

A *Best Practices Guide for Dust Management in Alberta* (the Guide), that includes:

- contextual information about dust and regulatory requirements in Alberta
- guidance and information to develop a dust management plan
- detailed technical supporting information

Next steps:

- An appropriate organization should track dissemination and use of the Guide
- The Guide should be reviewed and updated as appropriate over time
